# **DR. BARES AWARD**

# Competition Rules 2015

## Preamble

- 1. The management of pharmaceutical company PRO.MED.CS Praha a. s. announces, usually in two-year intervals, a competition for the best scientific work in the fields of gastroenterology and hepatology.
- 2. The competition has been held since 1993. In 2005 it was, on the occasion of paying tribute to its founder, the long-standing general director of PRO.MED.CS Praha a.s. and distinguished patron of gastroenterology, Dr. Rudolf O. Bares, renamed the Dr. Bares Award.
- 3. The purpose of this document is to set complete and clear rules of the Dr. Bares Award competition for 2015. These generally binding competition rules are the only document that bindingly sets competition terms and conditions and its presentation in the Company's promotional materials.
- 4. These competition rules may only be modified by written amendments numbered in ascending order.
- 5. The competition rules, as well as the whole performance of the competition, are governed by the laws of the Czech Republic.

## I. Competition Organiser

- 1. The organiser of the Dr. Bares Award 2015 competition is pharmaceutical company PRO.MED.CS Praha a. s., with its registered office at Telčská 1, 140 00 Praha 4, Company Registration No.: 00147893, recorded in the Commercial Register maintained by the City Court in Prague, Section B, File 3.
- 2. The postal address for the delivery of competition mail is identical with the organiser's registered office.
- 3. The competition e-mail contact is: dr-bares-award@promed.cz.

# II. Announcement of the Competition

- 1. The competition is announced for the period of 2015.
- 2. The competition runs in three follow-up evaluation levels called:
  - a) Basic evaluation round,
  - b) National evaluation round,
  - c) International evaluation round

that are specified in detail in these Rules.

# **III.** Competition Participation Terms and Conditions

- 1. A competition participant may become any legally competent natural person who meets the following terms and conditions:
  - a) S/he will reach the age of 18 at minimum on the day of the application submission;
  - b) S/he is a health care professional; a professional is considered a person who performs medical practice in the fields of gastroenterology and/or hepatology;
  - c) At the time of application s/he has a permanent residence in one of the following countries: Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Czech Republic, Estonia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Poland, Russian Federation, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Ukraine or Uzbekistan (another citizenship is not an excluding criterion);
  - d) S/he is the author of the scientific article that is being submitted in the competition (see Article XI);
  - e) S/he becomes familiar and agrees with the competition rules and confirms its approval with the rules by his/her signature on the application form.

- 2. For the purpose of this competition a scientific article shall mean a professional article published in a professional periodical regardless of the publisher's state or country that presents the outcomes of the original research carried out by the author or by the team the author was a member of. The articles shall be full texts of works broken down according to publishers' requirements in terms of the structure of a scientific work (most frequently: summary, introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion, conclusion, and bibliography), including the usual method of source quotations, and/or with comments, rather than articles of informative character, editing materials, corrections, abstracts or summaries, even though published in a professional periodical. An abstract of a scientific paper, for example, from a conference) is not a scientific article.
- 3. A professional periodical is a scientific magazine that is reviewed and published as a periodical publication in printed or electronic form with an ISSN code assigned at the time of the scientific article publication (magazines with ISSN codes are internationally registered and therefore trackable. It is at the discretion of the evaluator to decide about the professional quality of the submitted articles). A professional periodical does not mean a daily newspaper or a popular-science magazine.
- 4. For the purpose of the competition a professional article shall meet the following criteria:
  - a) Original scientific work in the fields of gastroenterology and/or hepatology (clinical and experimental, including in-vitro and in-vivo studies, epidemiological works, meta-analyses, etc.),
  - b) It was published in a professional periodical in the period from 1 January 2013 to 31 December 2014,
  - c) It may be submitted only once, i.e., by only one competition participant.
- 5. The scientific article must be submitted and sent to the organiser in printed or electronic form (reprint, copy or PDF) together with the application.
- 6. Should a scientific article be submitted in electronic form it is required to send a scanned copy of the scientific article from the professional publication including a scanned copy of the contents and the cover page of the respective professional publication.
- 7. Should both printed and electronic versions be submitted the electronic version must be identical with the printed version.
- 8. Should the scientific article be published in a language other than English, it may be submitted to the competition as well. However, the inclusion of such scientific article in the international evaluation round is contingent upon its translation into English by the deadline and in the format specified by the organiser.
- 9. A participant may enter the competition with more scientific articles, however, always using a separate application per each.
- 10. Authors of scientific articles are eligible for the competition only as individuals. It is not possible to apply as a scientific team or institution, or any legal entity.

# **IV.** Competition Application

- 1. Participation in the Dr. Bares Award 2015 competition is contingent upon a complete and legible application.
- 2. The application data shall be duly and truthfully written in Roman alphabet (in English).
- 3. The application form with the participant's signature, including annexes, shall be delivered to the organiser's address or to the competition's contact email address: dr-bares-award@promed.cz not later than by 30 April 2015. The "Dr. Bares Award" note must be written within the recipient's address. Applications submitted electronically to <u>dr-bares-award@promed.cz</u> should state "Dr. Bares Award" in the subject of the email.
- 4. Applications for the competition (application period) may be submitted from 1 January to 30 April 2015.

- 5. An application form is a part of these Rules (Annex A) and is available on the organiser's website pages www.promedcs.eu until the end of the application period.
- 6. The decisive date for accepting participants' applications is the date when the application is accepted by the organiser. For electronically submitted applications a reply shall be automatically generated confirming the receipt of the application; for postal submissions, an acknowledgment of the application receipt shall be sent to the participant's contact e-mail address within three (3) work days of the application delivery.
- 7. Only one published scientific article can be submitted per application. Any other scientific articles may always be submitted with a new separate application.
- 8. By signing and submitting the application a participant undertakes to observe the competition rules without exception and to follow the organiser's instructions.
- 9. The organiser also accepts electronic applications if they contain all requested data, signature, and annexes. In such an event the application must be completed, printed and signed in one's own hand and its scanned copy sent electronically.

# V. Basic Evaluation Round

- 1. Formal aspects of all applications received in the application period are evaluated in the basic evaluation round.
- 2. The basic evaluation is performed by the competition organiser from 1 May to 31 May 2015.
- 3. Applications must be properly, fully and truthfully completed, delivered within the application period, and have all required documents attached.
- 4. The competition organiser reserves the right to decline an application if it fails to meet the rules set by the organiser, even in minute detail.
- 5. The organiser will not accept applications delivered after the application period has expired, repeated applications with identical scientific articles, and applications with scientific articles that were not published in the period 2013–2014, even if their acceptance for printing has been proven.
- 6. The organiser has the right to ask a participant at any time to add or clarify information needed for the basic evaluation round. Should a participant fail to do so the organiser is entitled to decide about his/her disqualification from the competition.
- 7. A participant who meets the criteria for the basic evaluation round will advance to the national evaluation round.
- 8. The advancement to the national evaluation round will be performed by the organiser by dividing the scientific articles that meet the competition criteria according to the participants' permanent residency and passing them on the appropriate national evaluators. At the same time, the organiser will also determine the maximum number of works that may, according to the rules, advance from the national to the international round.
- 9. The organiser will announce in public the final results of the basic evaluation round and composition of national committees on 1 June 2015 on the website www.promedcs.eu.

# VI. National Evaluation Round

- 1. The national evaluation round is done by the national evaluator responsible for the regularity of the competition at the national level who coordinates selection of works in the country s/he represents.
- 2. The national evaluator is appointed by the competition organiser.
- 3. The organiser may appoint a maximum of two more evaluators who will become members of the national committee. This national committee, if established, evaluates

the works that have advanced to the national evaluation round. Each member of the national committee casts one vote. The national committee decides by majority vote.

- 4. A national evaluator and a member of a national committee must:
  - a) Be a generally recognised expert in the field of gastroenterology and/or hepatology in the territory of state where the national evaluation round is performed,
  - b) Agree with the membership in the national committee,
  - c) Follow organiser's instructions and these Rules.
- 5. Scientific articles that are eligible for the competition are evaluated by the national evaluator (and/or by the national committee) in terms of:
  - a) Originality of the scientific article,
  - b) Significance and benefits for medical field,
  - c) Application of results in practice.
- 6. Overview scientific articles, sets of scientific articles, abstracts, posters, essays, doctoral or dissertation theses, books, textbooks and collection of abstracts will be excluded in the national evaluation round. Also, so far not published scientific articles and scientific articles already awarded in another similar competition will be excluded from the evaluation.

Should less than 30 works for one country advance into the national evaluation round a national evaluator (and/or a national committee) will select three (3) works for nomination for the international evaluation round.

- 7. Should more than 30 works advance into the national evaluation for one country, a national evaluator (and/or a national committee) has a right to select another one for each started 10 scientific articles for the international evaluation.
- 8. A national evaluator (and /or a national committee) has a right to select less than three scientific articles to advance into the international evaluation round, and/or even not to select any.
- 9. A national evaluator will hand over the selected scientific articles that advance into the international evaluation round to the organiser including written justification for the selection in English by 18 September 2015.
- 10. The organiser is not entitled to influence the decision making of a national evaluator (and/or of a national committee) in any manner and must respect his/her evaluation results.
- 11. The organiser is entitled to ask a national evaluator for more detailed written clarification of his/her selection.
- 12. The work of a national committee member is not paid, however, the organiser may reimburse him/her, based on previous agreement with a national evaluator (and/or with a national committee), some administrative expenses that had to be incurred in relation to committee activities. The organiser does not cover any other costs incurred in relation to the work of a national committee.
- 13. The costs will be reimbursed by the organiser after having received the list of works advancing into the international evaluation round.
- 14. The organiser will hand over the scientific articles selected in the national evaluation round to the members of the international committee not later than by 30 September 2015.
- 15. The organiser will announce in public the results of the national evaluation round and composition of the international committee on 1 October 2015 on the website www.promedcs.eu.

## VII. International Evaluation Round

- 1. The international evaluation is performed by the international committee composed of a maximum of 7 members. The number of members of the international committee must always be odd.
- 2. Members of the international committee are appointed by the competition organiser, and an international committee member must:
  - a) Be an expert in the gastroenterology and/or hepatology fields,
  - b) Agree with his/her membership in the international committee,
  - c) Have a short-term work contract (Annex B) concluded with the organiser to perform work related to the competition international evaluation,
  - d) Follow organiser's instructions and these Rules,
  - e) Personally participate in meetings of the international committee.
- 3. Membership in the international committee is not directly contingent upon previous membership in a national committee, which also means that a national evaluator or a member of a national committee may become a member of the international committee.
- 4. The meeting of the international committee where the best three (3) scientific articles will be selected will take place by organiser on 24 October 2015.<sup>1</sup>
- 5. Prior to the activity commencement the members of the international committee will select the committee chair from their midst who will lead the discussions and have a decisive vote on controversial issues. When selecting the chair of the international committee, each member shall cast one vote, and the chair of the international committee shall be the person who receives the greatest number of votes.
- 6. The method of selection of the best three (3) scientific articles is within the competence of the international committee.
- 7. The international committee will select the best three (3) scientific articles at its meeting and will specify their placement order. The international committee chair will hand over the result to the organiser by midnight of the international committee meeting day including justification for the evaluation in writing as well as evaluation of individual articles selected in the English language.
- 8. Minutes will be taken of the international committee meeting and they will be signed by all members present. The minutes will be written by a person assigned by the organiser.
- 9. Should the international committee fail to select three (3) best scientific articles within the deadline, the organiser will take over the meeting and the selection of the winning articles will be done by a vote.
- 10. Members of the international committee will participate in the vote. Each committee member will, at his/her discretion, allocate the total of 10 points among scientific articles that are being evaluated. The committee chair will add the points assigned to individual scientific articles together and will give the organiser the list of three (3) scientific articles with the highest number of points including their placement order in the international evaluation round. The scientific article with the third highest number of points will rank the third, the scientific article with the second highest number of points will rank the second, and the scientific article with the highest number of points will rank the first. In case of coincidence of points for one of the winning positions the placement will be decided by the international committee chair. If voting takes place a written justification for the selection of the winning articles is not required.
- 11. A member of the international committee cannot be substituted during the meeting. Should s/he fail to participate in the meeting of international committee, s/he cannot be substituted by anybody, and the organiser shall not appoint any other person in his/her place.

- 12. The organiser shall not influence the decision process of the international committee in any manner whatsoever and shall respect its evaluation results.
- 13. The work of an international committee member done for the organiser in relation to the competition is remunerated by an amount of EUR 100 for active participation at the meeting regardless of the actual work duration, amount of work, and meeting complexity.
- 14. The organiser will reimburse the expenses incurred in relation to the participation in the meeting of the international committee to an international committee member, in particular travel and accommodation expenses.
- 15. The organiser will publicly announce the results of the international committee evaluation on www.promedcs.eu within 10 days after receiving the evaluation results from the international committee chair.

## VIII. Awards

- 1. Individual awards in the Dr. Bares Award 2015 competition shall be as follows:
  - a) In the basic evaluation round the participants are awarded by having their scientific article advanced into the national evaluation round.
  - b) In the national evaluation round selected scientific articles with equal placement will be awarded. The award for leading authors is a diploma and advancement of the scientific article into the international evaluation round. The organiser may grant a diploma also to individual co-authors of a selected scientific article. The diploma will be handed over by a person authorised by the organiser after the finish of the international evaluation round, unless agreed otherwise in advance.
  - c) A total of three (3) best scientific articles with their specified placement from place one to three will be awarded in the international evaluation. The prize for the leading author of a scientific article defined within the meaning of the competition rules (see Article XI) is a diploma and a financial award.
  - d) Financial prizes for the leading authors of scientific articles awarded in the international evaluation round for places one to three are:
    - $1^{st}$  place = EUR 10,000
    - $2^{nd}$  place = EUR 6,000
    - $3^{rd}$  place = EUR 3,000.
- 2. Other awards may be granted at the discretion of the organiser, who is also entitled to modify the amount of financial rewards.
- 3. The financial rewards are untaxed and will be taxed before payment by the organiser according to the applicable laws of the Czech Republic, or according to the applicable laws of the country in which the recipient is liable for paying taxes.
- 4. The organiser will pay financial rewards by bank transfer based on the handover of the Financial Reward Record (Annex C).
- 5. By payment of the taxed financial prize by the organizer no other tax obligations, if any, of the receiver shall cease to exist.
- 6. Alternative payment of the prize in other currency or in kind is possible only based on the organiser's approval.
- 7. If the organiser cannot deliver or otherwise hand over the award according to the instructions agreed upon in advance, and/or if the delivery thereof is connected with any unexpected difficulties, the entitlement to such award shall cease to exist.

# IX. An Official Announcement of the Results and Awards Handover to the Winning Participants of the International Evaluation Round

- 1. Awards will be handed over to the winning participants of the international evaluation round personally by a representative of the organiser and by a representative of the international committee at the award ceremony of the Dr. Bares Award 2015 competition to be held in 2016.
- 2. Award receivers are obliged to respect the award handover terms and conditions. The award handover is contingent upon the signing of the Financial Reward Handover Record for the Dr. Bares Award 2015 competition (Annex C).
- 3. The awarded participants will receive their diplomas and signed Financial Reward Handover Records during the award ceremony. Financial prizes will be transferred to the accounts of the winning participants in compliance with the respective Financial Reward Handover Records.
- 4. Should a winning participant be not able to personally attend the award ceremony, s/he is entitled to authorise a proxy to receive his/her award based on a written power of attorney with an authenticated signature.
- 5. If the award is not handed over during the award ceremony at the venue and the time specified by the competition organiser for reasons on the part of the winning participant and/or his/her proxy, the award shall be forfeited for the benefit of the organiser.
- 6. The organiser will hand over the awards also to the co-authors of awarded scientific articles in form of diploma issued to individual awardees indicating the full title of the respective article and it will hand them over to such co-authors either by post or personally through an authorised person within 1 month of the official announcement of the results of the international evaluation round.
- 7. The venue and date of the award ceremony will be specified by the organiser during 2015 by a written amendment to these Rules.

## X. Personal Rights and Protection of Personal Data

- 1. By participation in the competition each participant agrees that the organiser has the right to use the names and pictures of the winning participants in promotional and advertising materials published by the competition organiser, and that video and sound record thereof may be taken and published for this purpose for the period of ten years after finish of the competition.
- By his/her signature and by submitting the application the participant agrees that his/her 2. personal data specified in the application will be included in the database of the PRO.MED.CS Praha a. s. company that the company administers. This data may subsequently be provided by the administrator to the processor for processing for marketing purposes, i.e., for offering of products and services, sending of information on events to be held, on products and other activities, as well as for sending of business messages by electronic means under Act No. 480/2004 Coll., for the period until this approval is withdrawn (a maximum of 10 years) with the provision that also other data may be added thereto. The participant recognises that s/he has the rights under Sections 11 and 21 of Act No. 101/2000 Coll., in particular that the provision of data is voluntary, that s/he may withdraw his/her approval at any time and without any charge at the company's address, that s/ has the right of access to his/her personal data and the right to modify such data, block incorrect personal data, dispose of such data, etc. In case of doubt regarding compliance with these rights by the administrator s/he is entitled to turn to the company and/or to directly address the Office for Personal Data Protection, with its registered office at Pplk. Sochora 27, Praha 7, Czech Republic.

## XI. Article Authorship

- 1. Regarding co-authorship of a scientific article the leading author is, for competition purposes, considered the person named first in the order of authors. The second author is considered the person specified in the second place in the order of authors, the third author is considered the person specified in the third place in the order of authors, etc.
- 2. Any of co-authors of an evaluated scientific article or any competition participant may be designated as the leading author if confirmed by signature of the leading author and if the name of the participant designated the leading author for the purposes of the competition is shown on the application in the authorship part.
- 3. These Rules exclude a possibility of shared first authorship for co-authors or competition participants. There shall always be one competition participant designated in compliance with the application data.

## XII. Final Provisions

- 1. By completing and submitting the application the competition participant declares that his/her rights to participate in this competition are not in any manner, legally or factually, limited. Should any third person turn to the organiser with claims related to the participation in the competition of a specific contestant, such competition participant undertakes to settle any and all claims of such third person instead of the organiser without undue delay and in full.
- 2. The persons who are not eligible for the competition or act in contradiction with the competition rules will not be entered in the competition. Should such person win the award would not be handed over. In such an event the next contestant would be put in the place of such unauthorised winner based on the decision of the competition organiser (in accordance with the data specified in the authorship part).
- 3. The competition organiser has the final right to expel a participant in case of suspicion that the participant has achieved his/her competition results by fraud or by behaviour that is at variance with good manners which may have influenced the competition results. Such decision of the organiser is final and cannot be appealed.
- 4. The organiser reserves the right to keep the competition materials received, or to dispose of them at its discretion, without compensation.
- 5. The competition organiser shall not be liable for any loss, non-delivery, delay of or damage to scientific articles sent electronically or through postal services (or some other transportation company) and awards sent by bank transfer or otherwise. At the same time the competition organiser is not responsible or liable for technical problems and/or non-delivery of applications and for any problems occurring due to transfer of messages by electronic means.
- 6. The competition organiser shall not reimburse any costs incurred by the participants in relation to their participation in the competition or in the award ceremony, apart from the costs necessarily incurred for personal handover of awards for winning scientific works selected by the international committee on the date and at the place of the award ceremony (transport, accommodation, etc.).
- 7. The organiser reserves the right to shorten, interrupt or completely cancel the competition without specifying the reasons and without compensation.
- 8. The organiser reserves the right to change or modify the competition rules any time at its discretion.
- 9. The organiser reserves the right to check compliance with the eligibility criteria for the competition participation, to evaluate entitlements to the award, and the right to make a final decision in contentious cases at its own discretion.

- 10. These competition rules, including annexes hereto, are available on the organiser's website pages at www.promedcs.eu, and at the same time they are available on the organiser's premises in writing.
- 11. Any disputes or ambiguities related to this competition shall be finally decided by the organiser.
- 12. Employees of the organiser and close persons thereof, i.e., persons in common household and other close persons within the meaning of Sections No. 116 and 117 of the Civil Code of the Czech Republic, are excluded from this competition participation.
- 13. Participation in the competition or awards cannot be enforced by any legal action.
